
## **Bowling**



## Tuscany & the Amalfi Coast

here should the Trumps go in 2013? We had been to Italy (Rome, Venice, Milan, Genoa and Pisa) in 1984. During that sojourn, we were struck by the beautiful Tuscany landscape. Also, we had never been south of Rome. So, when we discovered a tour entitled "Tuscany and the Amalfi Coast", we were off!

After spending the first night in Osia (near Rome), we departed for Tuscany with its wonderful hills and beautiful valleys. Our base for the next seven days was to be Chianciano located high on a hill overlooking a stunning valley. Our first venture would be the Orcia Valley to view the rolling hills and rich pallet of colors that creates the typical Tuscan landscape. The views are breathtaking as we wend our way to Radicofini, which lays in the shadow of a medieval hilltop fortress. Here, about 1000 people live in what can only be described as a rabbit warren composed of stone and brick homes connected by one-way, cobblestone streets. We have truly returned to the Middle Ages.

Then, it's off to the "Casato Prime Donne" Brunello of Montalcino winery where we have a light lunch and a wine tasting bonanza. The vineyard is totally staffed by women and is world famous for its Brunella wine. Ah, Tuscany! Sipping wine amongst beautiful scenery. It's what we do best.

Firenza (Florence), on the banks of the Arno River, is our next encounter. Florence came into its own in the 13<sup>th</sup> century when merchants and tradesmen organized guilds that commissioned works of art to adorn churches and palaces. This amazing outburst of art and architecture completely changed the face of Tuscany. Names such as Dante, Bocaccio, Fra. Angelico, Donatello, Botticelli, da Vinci and Michelangelo define Florence. Dante is actually known as the father of the Italian language.

Here we viewed such structures as the Duomo (and its magnificent dome), the Babtistry, the Town Hall and a host of others. The Gates of Paradise, two impressive bronze doors, intricately depict scenes from the bible.

Another great event in Florence was the pick-pocketing of Jim Trump. He lost his cards to a thief who managed to extract his wallet from a very deep, Velcro-fastened front pocket. That guy was good!

Finally, on the way home, we made a very special stop at the Florence American Cemetery and War Memorial, where

4,398 crosses commemorate the deaths of American soldiers in WW II. This is actually US soil ... on permanent loan to the USA. Yours truly and three others were allowed to lower and fold the American flag as taps played in the background. Today is 9/11/13!

Ah, Siena, a wondrous medieval city with its stupefying Duomo and the head and thumb of St. Catherine. That's right ... the head and thumb! At one time, Siena's prominence rivaled that of Florence until the plague devastated it in the 14th century. Later, the Medeci's conquered it and brought it down.

Today, Siena is famous for its Palio: two horse races that take place in "Il Palazzo Pubblico." This giant plaza becomes a race course twice a year as various city communities vie for bragging rights. Here, a horse can win without his jockey on board.

Next, we find ourselves in Pienza; followed by Assisi, Cortona and Orvieto. All are wonderful in there own way. St. Francis is forever linked to Assisi as, in our minds, Andre Rieu is linked to the Piazza della Republica in Cortona. Go get the CD, "Andre Rieu in Tuscany" and you'll know what we mean.

Now, we must say "Goodbye" to Tuscany with its valleys, hills, cypress trees and medieval towns and cities! We also say "Goodbye" to the duomos and cathedrals. Every time there was a miracle in Italy, they built a church. Sorrento, get ready for us.

Sorrento is built on the slopes of many steep hills facing the Bay of Naples. Here, our hotel is VERY 5 star and our room is gigantic ... with a wrap-a-round veranda facing Naples and the bay. After an orientation walk, Marta found a Laundromat at a major traffic intersection. For the next hour, we were entertained watching the organized chaos of autos, trucks, scooters, cycles and bikes navigating and intermingling without crashing. No traffic lights required here!

We had heard about the Amalfi Coast with its narrow, steep roads and hairpin turns. What a thrill as we navigate these roads and view the rugged, stunning shoreline decorated by majestic rock formations and colorful fishing boats. After a stop in Amalfi, situated at the mouth of a steep gorge, we head for Scala, the oldest town on the coast dating back over 1000 years. Here, at 1200 feet above sea level, our restaurant provides an incredible view ... along with great sword-fish and veal.

Today, we head to Pompeii and a "home-hosted" lunch. Pompeii is truly amazing! Totally buried under 50 to 60 feet of ash by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in AD 79, it was not discovered until the 17<sup>th</sup> century ... and then by accident. The

site is vast and you can really get a good "feel" as to how the residents lived, built their homes and conducted business ... even in the brothels. Truly amazing is the viewing of bodies lying where they died!

Our "home hosted" lunch at the farm of a Sorrento family turned into a bacchanal. Way too much pasta, meat and wine, along with lemonchello and other sundry liqueurs. High above the Bay of Naples, this small farm contained animals, numerous fruit trees and a resident ostrich. Those eggs are BIG!

Finally, the enchanting Isle of Capri! Sitting like a gem in the Bay of Naples just opposite of Vesuvius, this fabled isle has been a popular destination since ancient times. Many Roman emperors made it their destination. The island abounds with hills, cliffs, grottos and garden terraces that all overlook the Amalfi Coast. Unfortunately, it also abounds with tourists, which greatly reduces its charm.

While there, we took a jitney up the "Mama Mia" road to Anacapri, the highest point on the isle. Under no circumstances would I drive up that so called "two lane" road. But, what spectacular views! We finished the day with a boat trip around the isle that brought us to the White Grotto and the famous Faraglioni Rocks jutting out of the water. Here, we go through and around these gigantic behemoths.

On the road to Rome, we drove up to the Abbey of Montecassino. Founded by St. Benedict in 529 AD, it is one of Europe's oldest monasteries. This stunning abbey has been destroyed and rebuilt many times over the centuries. Most recently, it was completely devastated by the Allies during WW II, but the statue of St. Benedict, dating from 1736, remained intact. It has now been carefully reconstructed following the original plans. It is difficult to believe it was ever destroyed.

And then it ends with an evening in Roma with time to mull over our adventure. What were the highlights? How about the following:

The gorgeous Tuscany landscapes. Nothing like it that we know of.

Sipping wine while viewing magnificent vistas and watching Italians and traffic.

Touring those incredible medieval towns that haven't changed in centuries.

The heart-stopping Amalfi Coastline and the wondrous Isle of Capri.

The amazing Pompeii and the slumbering Vesuvius.

The absolute best tour guide we ever had! Witty, charming, knowledgeable, and speaking perfect English, she enchanted us all.

# Fundraising Starts for Veterans Wall

Fundraising efforts have begun for the construction of a Vietnam Memorial Wall in Punta Gorda's Laishley Park honoring the men and women who lost their lives serving the nation.

The Vietnam Wall of Southwest Florida committee, a grassroots organization comprised of local veteran groups and interested citizens, kicked off a campaign Thursday to raise some \$400,000 for a new memorial to be built in Laishley Park that will resemble the original Vietnam Wall in Washington, D.C.

"This will be a 60% replica of that wall," said Kim Lovejoy, executive director of the Military Heritage Museum at Fishermen's Village in Punta Gorda. "It will have all the names on it that are on the official one, and there will be room on it just as there is on the official one for additional names to be added as missing-in-action soldiers are found and returned."

The wall will be built behind the Veterans Garden Gazebo at Laishley Park and will measure "296 feet from end to end, and 6 feet high at the apex," Lovejoy said.

Charlotte County Veteran Services officer and fundraising committee chair David Donohew said the project would take roughly a year to complete. So far, though, there is no set date for when construction might begin, he said. "It's whenever we raise the money," Donohew said.

One thousand donation envelopes will be distributed throughout the community as well as corporations and sports organizations, Donohew said. The funds will be administered by the Charlotte Community Foundation.

Punta Gorda City Councilman Tom Cavanaugh, who was instrumental in the site selection for the structure, said the wall would be a tremendous benefit to the city. The city has agreed to contribute engineering and design services with regards to the monument's installation.

"It would provide a wonderful site for (veterans) to go and remember their comrades who were lost in Vietnam," Cavanaugh said. "We're excited about it."

According to Donohew, there are 25,181 veterans in Charlotte County. "That's about one out of every 6.3 persons in Charlotte County is a veteran," Donohew said. "Plus, we have 1,652 Military retirees."

Currently, there are five traveling walls crisscrossing the U.S., three other fixed replica walls, and the national Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C., constructed in 1982.

In 2009, when one of the traveling walls was brought to Punta Gorda, the response was tremendous, officials said.

"It had 80,000 to 100,000 visitors, which was the best showing, the best number of visitors that this particular wall has ever received," said Lovejoy, recounting the comments made by the Melbourne, Fla., man responsible for bringing the wall to town. "And he's been all over the country."






