We would love the opportunity to see him again!" Tim's already planning to ride in the parade next year. There's no doubt that he'll be greeted by many delighted friends and fans.

JANUARY LIAISON MEETING MINUTES

February 18, 2019

- Road resurfacing will begin around April 14, 2019. Culde-Sac's 49, 50, 51, 19 & 20 will be done this year.
- ELS has received permission to start the fountain behind the pool at low pressure. It will have a bubbling effect.
- 46M is having destructive root issues. Joshua Tree Service will take care of this problem in the near future.
- 360 Inspections will be conducted on Feb. 20th and 21st.
- Concerns on trash situation on Sun Air Ct. were discussed. Julie will speak with staff concerning this issue.
- Management is looking into a plan to address any illegible street signage immediately and a long-term plan for replacement signage. Any leaning signs will be addressed.
- ELS Management has always worked with the HOA board to maintain the Prospectus standards and requirements, however, ELS has the ultimate decision to approve/deny any proposed modifications/changes to a home or home site.
- ELS Management will conduct an inspection of all mailboxes and replace any tubes that are missing.
- The Waste Pro leak on Circle Pine was discussed. Julie will inspect the area to see if any additional action needs to be taken.
- The Clubhouse roof replacement will begin on Feb. 24th. Julie stated that there will always be a point of entrance to the Clubhouse for the daily activities.
- The boat is back in the driveway at 14G. Julie will follow up.
- The awning in front of the clubhouse will be replaced as soon as the new roof is installed.
- Julie will follow up on the status of the exercise bicycle.
- ELS measured the square footage of the poolroom/activity room. There is approximately 1400 sq. feet excluding the kitchen area.
- Walking paths need to be washed and trees/bushes need to be trimmed. Julie will follow up.
- A visually impaired resident on Circle Pine Rd. has requested a sign notifying vehicles that a visually impaired person lives nearby. Julie will order a sign.
- Julie is currently working on a solution for her staff who must take a 30-minute break if they work 5 hours or more.

Pine Lakes community has once again generously donated blankets for the homeless in the Ft. Myers area. The original drive was spearheaded by Donna and Bob Morris, assisted by Pat and John Deveney, six years ago and then passed on to the Women's Club to continue. Jesse Howard and Jane Vogel co-chaired the event again this season. This year our Women's Club invited Lake Fairways Women's Club to join us in collecting and distributing blankets. Once blankets are collected, volunteers wrap each one in a dry-cleaning bag to keep it clean and dry and present a more manageable package for the person receiving the blanket.

Donations from three groups within our community made it possible for us to purchase 300 packages of two 5 x 7-foot tarps to also give away with the blankets. People utilize the tarps to protect themselves and their meager possessions from the wind and the rain, in addition to building primitive shelter for themselves.



HOORAY! PINE LAKES PONDS ARE FULL AND OVERFLOWING

Many residents at Lake Fairways still think that something is wrong when Pine Lakes ponds are nearly full and the ponds at Lake Fairways are not looking good like they did for most of December and January. We at Lake Fairways should now be thankful and we should hope and pray that Pine Lakes ponds remain full and overflowing.

Rainfall was below normal for October, November, December and most of January. Then we received about an inch of rain on January 24th and 2.4 inches on January 27th according to Lee County's official rain gauge at Lake Fairways. Some people reported as much as 3 ½ inches on the 27th. Well, hooray. With only 3 to 4 ½ inches of rain, our pond water level at Lake Fairways came up more than 15 inches. On February 5, nearly two weeks after the rainfall filled Pine Lakes ponds, our ponds at Lake Fairways are still rising a little bit every day.

How can that be? When you are driving, walking, riding your bike or golf cart around in Lake Fairways, just stop at Firestone Court, walk across the Perimeter road (Lakewood Shores Circle) toward Pine Lakes and look down into the storm water inlet between the perimeter roads. You will likely see and hear water flowing through that inlet from the full and overflowing ponds at Pine Lakes into Lake Fairways ponds. That will continue as long as Pine Lakes ponds remain full and overflowing.

Now and into the future, don't complain about Pine Lakes ponds being full. Instead, just hope and pray that the ponds at Pine Lakes are always full and overflowing. That would be great for Lake Fairways, especially if we would get normal rainfall, about 2 ½ inches per month during the winter season.

Is it possible to return the ponds at Lake Fairways to the way they looked in the 1990's. YES, ABSOLUTELY. The pond banks were destroyed due to the mismanagement of the Lake Fairways principle spillway by the owner, manager. Restoring the pond banks and operating the spillway precisely as it was designed would have the ponds looking even better during the winter season because of the Pine Lakes overflow now coming into the Lake Fairways ponds.

PLEHOA ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES CLUBHOUSE BALLROOM

February 11, 2019 [Subject to approval Feb. 10, 2020]

The Annual Members' meeting of the Pine Lakes Homeowners' Association was held on February 11, 2019. President Pete Williams called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM in the Ballroom of the Clubhouse. Lew Ackley reviewed the submitted Proxies and combined with the members present was able to state that the specified quorum had been met and that the Annual Meeting could proceed.

Board members present were: President Pete Williams, Vice President Matt Heier, Director and ARC Chair Dick Loubier, Treasurer Wendy Saniti, and Secretary Carl Schlachter.

Secretary Carl Schlachter read the Proof of Notice of Meeting certifying that the notice to all members, either hand-delivered or mailed was completed. The notice was certified by a Notary Public and posted on the Board's bulletin board in the Clubhouse as required.

Secretary Carl Schlachter read the minutes from the previous Annual Meeting held on February 12, 2018 and the minutes from the board meeting of January 9, 2019. A motion was made and seconded to accept both reports as read. Motion passed.

President Pete Williams introduced the candidates, Cindy Ahrens, Bob Godek, Dick Loubier, Wendy Saniti, and Nikki Grove-Todd. Each made comments to the members.

Wendy Saniti gave the treasurer's report. At this time all but three home owners have paid their lot rent. Liens have been placed on two of the homes and they will place a lien on the third home soon. A motion was made and seconded to accept the treasurer's report as read. Motion passed. The full report will be posted on our bulletin board.

ARC Chair Dick Loubier reported he has had one request for improvements since the last meeting and it was approved.

President's Report:

President Williams reported the Pub renovations have been moved to 2020. Bulkheads are currently being replaced. ELS will check on the possibility of white lines as well as the cost for Circle Pine. Julie is a great manager to work with and gets as much done as possible for Pine Lakes. The Sheriff's Department was given access to the tapes from the front gate at Lake Fairways when the golf carts were stolen. The proposed new prospectus removes the cap on the leased land fees. Some rules were changed. The contract for estate properties expires in 2022. It can be extended for five years if either party gives a 60-day notice and both parties agree to the extension. The 360 inspections are still behind schedule. The new roof on the club house is scheduled to start soon.

Resident concerns:

- 1. A resident asked if road repaving would continue this year, and it will.
- 2. Why does the Pub close at 3:00 PM on Sunday and Monday? Due to lack of business during this time period.

 3. Does the party prospectus effect estate home owners?
- 3. Does the new prospectus affect estate home owners? PLEHOA has a contract with ELS.

Lew Ackley and his volunteers from the Nominating Committee conducted the vote for the four openings on the board as well as the vote for the suspension of the requirement for an audit.

The board members elected were Cindy Ahrens, Bob Godek, Wendy Saniti, and Dick Loubier. Cindy, Bob, and Wendy were elected for a two-year term. Dick was elected for a one-year term. The waiver to eliminate the requirement for a year-end audit passed.

With no further business to conduct, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting at 8:06 PM.

The next Board meeting will be on March 13 in the Living Room at 7:00 PM. The next Annual Meeting will be the second Monday in February, 2020.

What you can do to protect yourself from these scammers?


• If 'Microsoft' is calling you – **HANG UP!** The real Microsoft does not do call outs.
