HOAII, INC AND WHAT IT MEANS TO RESIDENTS

In a recent issue of the **Whispering Pines** the HOAII Board published the lot numbers of those residents who had not yet paid their 2017 dues. Some people said thank you for reminding me, some ignored us, and some got very angry. After discussions with the HOAII Board and our WP editor, it was decided that I would write an article about the history of HOAII and what we do.

HOAII was incorporated in June of 1990 under the authority of Chapter 723 of the Florida Statutes, The Florida Mobile Home Act. In order to form the HOA, the residents were required to have 2/3 of the residents sign a petition to form the organization. These signatures were filed with the Florida State Department and HOAII became a corporation in the state of Florida. According to 723 and the Articles of Incorporation, all residents in Pine Lakes that live on leased land and their successors are members of HOAII, Inc.

Because HOAII is the only organization that includes all residents on leased land and the Board is elected by those residents, HOAII is the only organization that can legally represent the residents. We work in cooperation with the PLEHOA, the estate owners, and meet with ELS management monthly. These meetings are reported in the **Whispering Pines**. Residents are always encouraged to talk to their Board members about issues they would like to see on the agenda for this meeting.

HOAII has on a number of occasions taken legal action against ELS. The most recent of these occurred in 2013 when ELS wanted to charge for trash pickup which our prospectus and leases say is included in our lot rent. Up to

that time we were paying for the dumping fee for the large dumpster at the back of the property. ELS wanted to charge us an additional \$117 per year for Waste Pro to pick up our trash. HOAII hired a lawyer, got over 50% of the residents to sign a complaint and filed with the Department of Business and Professional Relations (DBPR). This resulted in 2 failed attempts at mediation so we filed suit in the Lee County circuit court. A week before we were to go to court for the first hearing, ELS, via their attorney, said that they wanted to talk and after 6 hours of discussion, we reached an agreement. Residents on leased land would continue to pay the dump fee but would not pay for trash pickup. As a result, everyone who owned a home on leased land on January 1, 2016, received a \$234 credit on the pass-through charges for the 2014-15 trash pickup charges. In addition, everyone who lives on leased land is paying \$117 less per year in pass-through charges. This legal action cost HOAII a little over \$11,000, but to date this action has saved the residents of Pine Lakes \$272,844 and will continue to save them \$68,211 per year.

Unlike the estate owners, Chapter 723 does not allow HOAII to require members to pay dues. We ask that residents voluntarily pay \$20 a year to support the activities of HOAII. Where does the money go? At the annual membership meeting on the third Monday of January, the Board President presents a detailed budget which has to be approved by the Board. The biggest expense we have is insurance. Since we run all our own activities at Pine Lakes, the two Boards carry a million-dollar liability policy on every volunteer and on the 14 board members. Our share of this policy is a little over \$2,000. We then have our share of the cul-de-sac captain's appreciation dinner,

income tax preparation, fees to file our annual report with the state, secretary and treasurer supplies, president's travel expenses, and we contribute a small amount to the holiday decorations -- this all adds up to about \$5,000. Any unbudgeted funds from dues paid are earmarked to re-building our legal fund. For example, there are 583 homes on leased land -- if 300 of those homes pay the \$20 annual dues, we will collect \$6,000 which means \$1,000 goes into the legal fund. At this rate, it may take us over 11 years to build our legal fund back to the 2013 level.

Residents who pay their dues feel that they are carrying the load for those who do not. Some residents who do not pay feel that they get no benefit from the HOAII. Others just do not care or may dislike someone on the Board. My concern is that we build up the legal fund before there is a need for new ELS legal action.

I would like to leave you with this question. On the first of January when you are writing your check to ELS for your pass-through charges and it is \$117 less than it would be without HOAII, is it too much to ask that you give us \$20 of that \$117?

JUNE LIAISON MEETING

In our short time here we noticed how ELS tries to run our community. Example, when ELS tried to raise the pass-through on leased land residents, HOAII stepped up and I think we see what can happen when we work together.

I thought that I had to step up, get involved. Now I've decided to help get out this information to all, so that we could make enlighten decisions. With membership in FMO you have a way of knowing what's going on in Tallahassee that might adversely affect you and your retirement life style.

C.E.R.T. UPDATE

Eight people completed the 5 part C.E.R.T course in May. It was quite interesting and informative.

Some things we learned :

We at Pine Lakes are in Zone C for evacuation. Our closest shelter is in Zone D (Lehigh Acres). The shelter at the Local High School is in Zone C and will be evacuated if Zone C is evacuated. So the closest shelter to us is used for Zones A & B, not us. Charlotte County is a low lying area and has NO shelters. Best advice if evacuating is to go North to another State. Leave early. There is no guaranteed safe place to go in Florida to avoid a hurricane.

Cell Phones will probably not work due to Local government turning them off for public use so they can use for emergency services only,
Or cell towers may be damaged.

If you choose to shelter in place be sure you have provisions and water to last at least 3 to 7 days. Prepare to be without electricity.
