ffective Monday January 6, 2014, procedures will change for the trash, recyclables, and horticulture disposal. Equity LifeStyles has contracted with WastPro to dispose of all our trash. The procedures and schedule are the same for both Pine Lakes and Lake Fairways.

The schedule will be as follows:

- Monday Recyclables and horticulture
- Tuesday Trash
- Friday Trash

All horticulture is to be put our in your yard. The horticulture depot will no longer be available and will be locked.

Large items (furniture or appliances,etc) should be placed at the curb. On trash day these items will be tagged for pick up by another truck the following day. There is no need to call the office or WastePro before placing the items at the curb.

When there is a holiday, the complete schedule will be pushed back one day.

WastePro will be providing a brochure that will be inserted in the January calendar.

December Liaison Meeting

December liaison meeting was held December 12th in the living room. The first item on the agenda was to remind ELS that according to 723 of the Florida statutes, ELS must obey the rules of the community including the placement of signs.

The next item was the continuing deterioration of the roads. Steve said we are still on track for resealing during the first quarter of 2014. He then plans to bring in an engineer to develop a plan to replace the roads. He will share this plan with the residents when it is developed.

ELS believes that the new clubhouse roof is sound. The dirty ceiling tiles in some of the rooms are old tiles that have yet to be replaced.

The A/C unit over the store room in back of the stage has drainage problems. The A/C unit will be raised so that the drip pan can drain more easily.

A new drain was put in to drain cul-de-sac 35 and 35G's yard was never completely restored to its previous condition. ELS plans to sod this area, but not until they are sure the cool weather is over so that the grass does not become dormant before it gets a chance to establish itself.

We seem to be losing a lot of trash cans. Frank seems to know who is taking them and plans to buy more so that we have enough for the many events we have over the week-ends during season.

Two electrical outlets in the ballroom were identified as not working. Frank will investigate.

The electrical problems at the front of the community were discussed in detail. We have not been able to have Christmas lights in this area for over 10 years now. Also, if we want to put a fountain in the front continued on next page

lake we will have to have power in that area. ELS agreed to have an electrical contractor look at the area and recommend solutions including a plan for better lighting of the community entrance.

Yard waste chips continue to be dumped behind the fenced lot of WakeUp America. Frank thought the matter was handled but will investigate again.

A dangerous situation exists on the golf cart path behind cul-de-sac 40. Residents seem to like to walk on the cart path or fish while standing on the cart path. Since this is a blind curve, legal golf carts traveling very fast don't see the pedestrians and there have been a number of near misses. Frank said he would post a sign where the cart path intersects with Lake Loop Road.

There seemed to be some confusion over who is responsible for the light post in the residents' yards. According to the prospectus and the covenants, the residents are responsible for their post light and it should be working at all times. If ELS repairs your light, the resident will be charged the going rate.

There have been complaints about the condition of the billboards on Rt 41 between Pine Lakes and Lake Fairways. Steve said ELS just approved the new art work and the billboards are scheduled to be redone.

Residents are encouraged to discuss their concerns with their respective board members so that the issues can be added to the agenda of this monthly meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

The Board has received the annual \$200 retainer bill from our lawyers, Becker & Poliakoff. This payment covers a number of annual filings and minor consulting issues that arise each year. Motion was made and seconded to make this payment.

The Board has decided to go ahead with an audit for 2012 and 2013. It was felt that because there will be a change in the Treasurer's position this year that this was an important step to follow. Sue O'Donnell, a Pine Lakes homeowner, has graciously offered to handle this for us.

Questions expressed about calling Sherriff's office for soliciting. It is felt that this is not usually necessary. The Sherriff's office does patrol Pine Lakes on a regular basis and does have the authority to request to see contractor license.

There is no further information about possible changes with garbage/recycle pickup. It is hoped that Management will consider the size of containers and the need for the pickup of large items, ie furniture, water heaters, sheet rock, etc.

One homeowner would like to see something done about the trash left behind by those who maintain our property whether it be individual contractors and those hired by Management.

Motion was made to adjourn and seconded. Meeting adjourned at 7:55.

This Month's Covenant Reminders from your PLEHOA

rticle 5.02- Residents are allowed 2 vehicles per home with only one vehicle normally parked outside. No boats, trailers, recreational vehicles shall be placed, parked or stored in any driveway or Lot, other than for temporary cleaning or loading not to exceed 48 hours.

Article 5.05- No portion of any Lot shall be used as a drying or hanging area laundry of any kind.

Article 5.07- Rubbish, trash, garbage or other waste materials (including horticulture) shall be kept in suitable sanitary containers which shall be contained within buildings except for a reasonable period for refuse pickup, the night before of the morning of the day of the refuse pickup. (Horticulture should only be placed curbside on Wednesday or very early on Thursday for Thursday's scheduled pickup.)

As a reminder, trash is collected on Mondays and Thursdays, recycles are collected on Tuesday and horticulture is collected on Thursday. Do NOT take any trash that is NOT horticulture to the horticulture pit.

Article 5.08 – No garage, patio, or rummage sales are permitted on any Owner's lot or within any Owner's home.

Thank you to everyone for abiding by the covenants. When we all work together, we continue to make Pine Lakes a great place to call home.




Want to slow down your heart rate? Lower your blood pressure? Reduce chronic pain? Sharpen concentration? Reduce anxiety? Improve mobility?
