DECEMBER LIAISON MEETING

The December Liaison Meeting was held December 8 in the Living Room.

We started by discussing some of the houses that are not up to community standards and need power washing, yard work, or painting.

A tree is scheduled to be removed from 59B so the resident can again park in their driveway.

The drain by cul-de-sac 9 was cleaned. We won't know if this solved all the drainage problems until we get another heavy rain.

There was a lot of discussion about ELS not following the prospectus. They are discussing with their attorneys.

Due to what the residents think was a poor paving job on Sugarmill Court, grass is growing in the cracks in the middle of the street. ELS will investigate.

Cracks in the posts on the new bridges will be addressed when the bulkheads are repaired. Hopefully this will be in January.

The steps to the big golf score board were painted with yellow stripes to make them more visible at night. This had become a safety issue.

We have had a lot of complaints about the stove in the kitchen. A company will be contacted to look at repairs.

The manufacturer of the kitchen window overhead closure will be contacted about a new handle. ELS has not been able to locate one locally.

New tables will be ordered for the craft room.

Coastal Canvas will submit a bid for repairing the awning at the end of the Tiki Bar.

Cracks in the pool caulking were discussed.

There was a lot of discussion about the Pub. The residents resent the closing of the Pub during posted business hour with little or no notice. If the Pub hours are posted as 8AM to 7PM, then the Pub should be open to all residents

during those hours unless there is an emergency. The quality and prices of the food was discussed at length.

The liaison meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month. Residents are encouraged to inform their respective HOA boards members of items they would like to have on the agenda.

HELP MAKE PINE LAKES A SAFE AND **HAPPY PLACE**

The season is now in full swing and Pine Lakes ▲ is bursting at the seams. When we have so many people living in this active community we need to be more careful about observing the rules especially ones that are necessary for the safety of all.

Please obey the 20 mph speed limit. Also remember that walkers have priority then bicycles, then golf carts and finally cars.

Please obey all stop signs. These applies to golf carts as well as cars.

Please do not let your most precious possession, your grandchildren, drive your golf cart unless they are at least 16 years old. We have many commercial vehicles using our streets. These vehicles are often speeding and not watching for golf carts. Inexperienced drivers can not react as quickly as necessary in emergency situations. Also you can not react quickly enough many times if you have a child on your lap 'pretending' to drive.

Please do not walk on the golf cart paths. Early morning before the golfers start to play the workers are driving as fast as possible trying to finish the maintenance before the golfers start hitting balls at them. During the day we have many non residents playing our course. They are not watching for walkers on the course.

Please do not drive golf carts or ride bicycles on the walking paths. These paths are narrow and meant for residents to walk leisurely around the community enjoying our beautiful scenery and glorious weather. Dodging golf carts and bicycles does not contribute to a pleasant stroll.

Pets should not be in the recreation areas. These include the area around the clubhouse, the walking paths, and the golf course. Pets are not allowed in the clubhouse or Pub. Dogs should be walked around the perimeter of the property where waste cans are placed for your convenience when picking up after your pet;







PEARL HARBOR 75th ANNIVERSARY

At 10:00 a.m. on December 7, 2016, a group of Pine Lakes Veterans and friends laid a wreath at the monument to honor the 75th anniversary of the bombing of Pearl Harbor. The following notes were read:

On the night of December 6, morning of December 7: U.S. Intelligence decodes a message pointing to Sunday morning as a deadline for some kind of Japanese action.

The message is delivered to the Washington high command before 9:00 a.m. Washington time, more than four hours before the attack on Pearl Harbor. But the message is not forwarded to the Pearl Harbor commanders and finally arrives only after the attack has begun.

At 0755, Hawaiian time, the first wave of Japanese aircraft begin the attack. Along with ships in Pearl Harbor, the air stations at Hickam, Wheeler, Ford Island, Kaneohe and Ewa Field are attacked.

The Japanese attack continues for two hours and 20 minutes. When it's over, more than 2,400 Americans are dead and nearly 1,200 wounded. Eighteen ships have been sunk or damaged. More than 300 aircraft are damaged or destroyed.

On December 8, President Roosevelt addresses Congress and asks for a declaration of war against Japan, which he receives. He said then: "Yesterday, December 7, 1941, a date which will live in infamy, the U.S. of A. was suddenly and deliberately attacked by naval and air forces of The Empire of Japan."

Our military thought that Japan couldn't get to Pearl Harbor, that it was too long a journey, but they proved us wrong, stated Jerry Bruckheimer, coproducer of Pearl Harbor 2001.

After the surprise attack, Isoroku Yamamoto, Japanese Admiral, said, "I fear all we have done is to awaken a sleeping giant and fill him with a terrible resolve." Yamamoto's plane was shot down over the Solomon Islands on April 18,1943.




