## RAIN---RAIN---RAINY SEASON IS HERE!!

FMO by Linda Dowd

After our long dry season with crusty grass, rain is here with our first storm of the season. While our friends and neighbors made their long journey north, we will hold down the fort! The FMO (Federation of Manufactured Homeowners of Florida) is staying busy. We had our recent district meeting at Lake Fairways. We had people from all over the state and Pine Lakes, who attended to hear our guest speaker Jerry Durham, FMO Board President. He told us about FMO's 5-year agenda: To improve the web site so they can get more information posted to allow us to be more active in Tallahassee. Of course, to do this we need you and your membership to be able to show our state representative the power of the vote. As a reminder, you don't have to be an FMO member to attend meetings. For those who are not members of FMO, I can tell you the "Watchdog" informed us of the wording for the upcoming "Constitutional Amendment, Article XII, Section 27" regarding limitation on property tax assessment capped at 10%. Many of you don't have reasons to go to the clubhouse during "off season", but you need to go and read the wording of this bill that is posted on the FMO section of the bulletin board (copy

is included below). We are in a fight on ballot number 2. Please take the time to read this, or if your neighbor is a member, you might ask them to let you read it. You will be hearing more as the November election gets closer. This is just one of the many articles you will find in the FMO news magazine. You need to understand the meaning of this amendment, if not passed, it will affect how we get to enjoy our retirement years!

Regarding the contact that FMO was running (Nov. 1, 2017/April 15, 2018): This was for park representatives, BUT Maura and I decided to return that \$ to you (\$5 for 1 yr/\$10 for 3 yr). We have the final count from FMO, and we will be getting it to you. I'm sure you've heard this before "your check is in the mail".

Again, a reminder: you need to join FMO to get involved and keep up to date on the rights of manufactured homeowners in our state. You can get applications at the clubhouse, or from Maura Alexander @239-543-9642, or Linda Dowd @239-789-6626.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

ARTICLE XII, SECTION 27

Proposing an amendment to The State Constitution to permanently retain provisions currently in effect, which limit property tax assessment increases on specified non-homestead real property, except for school district taxes, to 10 percent each year. If approved, the amendment removes the scheduled repeal of such provisions in 2019 and shall take effect January 1, 2019.

## JUNE LIAISON MEETING

The meeting started with the introduction of Joshua Hill, owner and operator of Joshua Tree Service Co. Joshua explained that the grass was being mowed at a 3-1/2 inch cut but was recently dropped to a 3-1/4 inch cut. Joshua stated that grass grows faster if you mow it shorter. Pete mentioned that he did not have many complaints on the lawn service. Joshua stated that a supervisor drives around after every cut. They mow, trim and blow every time and edge every other time. David asked if hard tires were used on the mowers. Joshua stated that in some areas the soil is ripped, but it is due to the nature of the soil, i.e. wet or weedy. Joshua stated that he will meet with us as often as is needed.

David mentioned that the tree branches along the golf cart path need to be trimmed.

Julie asked Judy and Pete to communicate any complaints to her as soon as they happen.

Julie mentioned that Frank will do a second round of 360. A second letter on lamppost outages will be sent to owners.

Julie mentioned that Laura Horton will be handling our Accounts Receivables in the future.

### GROUNDS AND MAINTENANCE –

- The cameras at the security gate are working. Julie said the tapes are being kept for 30 days, however, she will ask the vendor if the tapes can be kept for 90 days.

- Julie stated that she is obtaining a second estimate on repairing the security gate.

- The fountain behind the pool has been shut off in preparation for moving it. Complaints have been made that the spray is affecting people in the pool area.

- Julie stated that crushed shells or gravel will be used as a base for cart parking at the pickle ball courts. Edging will be installed to keep the material in place.

### CLUBHOUSE –

- Judy mentioned that the ballroom floor looks good.

- Judy stated that there is a musty smell in the card room and there is mold in the air vent. There is also a smell in the Livingroom. Julie will have maintenance look into both issues.

- Judy stated that there is a leak in the card room by the clock. Julie said that she is requesting a new roof for the clubhouse for 2019.

- Judy mentioned that the toilet in the men's restroom is running. Julie will follow up.

### POOL –

- Squirrels and raccoons continue to be a problem in the pool area. Julie stated that she can schedule an exterminator for the raccoons but not sure what can be done for the squirrels.

### PUB –

- Judy mentioned that the new fans look great.

- Julie stated that the designer is working on the Pub renovation plans and that she has had several contractors to assess and evaluate. Waiting for recommendations.

## SILVER ALERT FOR PINE LAKES & LAKE FAIRWAYS

What to do if an impaired resident is lost and/or missing:

1. Check your home & property thoroughly, they may be hiding. **IF they took a CAR - CALL 911** with description of car – make, model, color, license plate #

2. Notify Pine Lakes Gate house: 239-731-2500. Give your name and phone #, their name with a physical description: height, weight, color of hair, any other distinguishing features. State if resident is on foot, in a cart, on a bike or in a car, vehicle description, last known location: Pine Lakes or Lake Fairways, lot number, cul-de-sac and estimated amount of time missing.

3. Gate House will:

A. Notify Calling Post, who will call everyone with pertinent information to begin a search.

B. Instruct original caller to stay close to their phone.

C. After 30 minutes, if resident is not found, Sheriff Dispatch # 239-477-1000 will be called.

D. Notify Calling Post when resident is found.

Please participate by searching near your home, including lake shore, golf course, and Preserve areas. Notify Gate House **Immediately** if you locate the missing person and stay with them.

The **“Homeowners”** section contains minutes of the latest liaison meetings with management, homeowners meetings as well as community rules and regulations. The Customer Service Form may also be downloaded from this section.

The **“Clubs and Activities”** page is a list of all clubs, sports and other activities within the community, including the names of board members or representatives of each club. Examples are the Men's Club, Women's Club, Chorus, Theater, Bocce, Line Dancing, Singles Club, FMO and many others. While many of the clubs provide a link with further details, not all clubs make full use of the website. To keep members and the community at large better informed, pertinent information may be sent to [webmaster@ourpinelakes.com](mailto:webmaster@ourpinelakes.com). Please note that commercial and political announcements do not appear on the website.

The **“Announcements”** page essentially replaces channel 195 of our Comcast service, providing notices regarding any club or activity. In essence, it highlights advertisements of activities found in the Whispering Pines. Obituary notices pertaining to Pine Lakes residents may also be posted here. Announcements may be posted 60 days prior to the event and should be removed the day after the event.

A copy of the monthly Pine Lakes calendar as well as contact information completes the website.

On occasion, emails are sent from the website to announce imminent community issues, such as the closing of the pool or boiled water notices, obituaries and last-minute changes to events.

To add your name to the distribution list, please contact the webmaster with your email address. Suggestions as to how the website may better serve the community are welcome.

### **I**s It Time to Buy a New Flag? Signs your flag is ready to be taken down and retired.

The US Flag Code says that when a flag becomes “unserviceable” and unable to properly represent our country, it should be retired in a respectful and dignified manner. But what exactly does “unserviceable” mean? When is it time to buy a new flag?

There are several signs that your flag may be ready for retirement:

- The colors are faded and have lost their original vibrancy
- The flag has several holes and/or tears beyond repair
- The edges have started to fray
- There are stains that cannot be removed

If any of these conditions apply, it is time to dispose of your American flag and proudly raise a new one. ***There is a box in the Pine Lakes Clubhouse lobby in which you may dispose of your old flag.***

(To keep your flag flying a little longer, you can repair it if it does get a small hole or tear. Sewing small holes or trimming frayed edges is allowed. If you find your flag has a stain, you can gently hand-wash it. If that does not work, you can also try dry cleaning it. But if that stain is too large or set-in, it may be time to buy a new one.)

Locally, flags may be purchased at Fleamasters’ Albino Rhino, Walmart, Target, Lowes, or Home Depot.

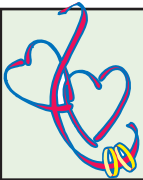
