

PROPOSED PINE LAKES EXPANSION UPDATE

of their HOAs. Because HOAII was asked to sign an agreement, we are technically in negotiations with ELS and required by law to inform the members of HOAII about these negotiations. The publication in the last issue of the Whispering Pine was our first attempt to do so. Because the residents in the estate section are affected by this purposed expansion, PLEHOA requested to be included in this meeting. Also attending the meeting, at the invitation of HOAII, were board members from the Lake Fairways HOA.

The meeting started with repeating what had already been published last month. Since then we have received a preliminary drawing of the site. This drawing shows 369 homes on lots that are over 3000 sq ft smaller than the existing lots. Most of our homes would not fit on these lots. The HOAII statutory committee has investigated the details of the site and provided these details to our attorney.

Through contacts HOAII has with the DBPR (Department of Business and Professional Regulations) we discovered that ELS filed an application for a new prospectus for Pine Lakes in June of 2018. This prospectus was asked to cover all lots (1A to 63L).

When DBPR replied that some of these lots were owned by the home owner and therefore not subject to a prospectus while all the other lots had homes with the existing prospectus, ELS replied with statements that are not true. The HOAII board set up a committee (Maura Alexander, Ron Hovat, and Mike Gloss) to compare this new prospectus with ours and review the differences with the board.

The statutory committee met with our attorney and reviewed the information we collected. Mr. Burandt then notified ELS that we would not sign any agreement. He also wrote letters to the DBPR and to all Lee County Commissioners. The letters all expressed that we are very opposed to this expansion. The letters to the commissioners requested that we be informed of any hearing concerning zoning changes to this area.

The feedback the HOA boards received at this meeting was 100% against the expansion. We did not receive one comment supporting the project. Most concerns center around our infrastructure, i.e. roads, water, sewer, and drainage issues. Other concerns are taxing our already busy amenities, increased traffic, and security. Lake Fairways is concerned about more traffic cutting through their community and the reduction in maintenance staff service with the expanded community. They also expressed their support in opposing this expansion.

PLEASE NOTE: If another prospectus is approved for Pine Lakes, ELS is not legally required to give new owners the existing prospectus. If a new owner is presented with a new prospectus and signs to accept it, the new prospectus applies to that house and its lot rent increases. Please make sure that when selling your house, the new owner gets a copy of the existing prospectus.

- For our estate home owners, we have Amendment #1 which would create another \$25,000 property tax break for homesteaders.
- Amendment #2 for lease land homeowners which covers limitations on property tax assessment. This is proposing an amendment to the state constitution to permanently retain provisions currently in effect. This

will keep tax at (except school district tax) 10%. So, this will definitely affect our lease land friends.

Both estate and lease land owners need to get out and vote YES on both amendments. These will affect how we continue to "Live the Dream". You will be hearing a lot more regarding these amendments.

I'm sure that most have heard about ELS wanting to add 369 home sites next door, to the north of us. They will have their own clubhouse and pool, BUT they will be able to use our amenities (tennis courts, pickleball courts, pub, etc.). Again, I'm sure you will be hearing a lot regarding this.

If approved, the amendment removes the scheduled repeal of such provisions in 2019 and shall take effect January 1, 2019.





They represent just a small group of all of us who live here and volunteer every day to make Pine Lakes better and who make Pine Lakes - well, **Pine Lakes!**

Pine Lakers are definitely a talented group of movers, shakers, and doers. In my opinion, however, there is one among us who does more moving, shaking, and doing then many of us realize that she does. I am referring to Judy Marie Englant Hale. Last Spring, I asked Judy if I could interview her and what follows is a small part of her life here in Pine Lakes and before.

"Mrs. Hale Only Speaks English!"

Judy Marie Englant, the youngest of three children, was born in Canton, Ohio to John and Marie (Scott) Englant. Her sister, Ruth, is 9 years older than Judy, is a retired middle school teacher, and still lives in the same house she's lived in for the last 65 years. John, Judy's brother, passed away 4 years ago and was 4 ½ years older than Judy. John was a church pastor for many years before he became head of the Allegheny Wesleyan Methodist Church. He was also President of their college where he taught Greek, Hebrew, and Theology.

Judy and her husband, Art, always knew that they wanted to retire in Florida. So, Judy would clip ads that she saw about retirement communities, and they would visit them while on vacation in the Sunshine State. By the time that they first visited Pine Lakes in 1993, Art had been retired for 6 years but Judy was still working. They really liked that the ads were truthful, and of course, they also really liked that there was a golf course, a restaurant, large lots, and the cul-de-sac design. They left that first visit with Pine Lakes on their short list.

In 1996, Art and Judy received information from Pine Lakes saying they only had 35 homes left. Pine Lakes flew them down and housed them in a guest house while they looked for a house to buy. Bob Brown was in the process of selling the community to MHC (later became ELS) and he was dealing. The house they chose was under construction at the time and they ended up buying it for half the listed price. Since Judy was still not retired, Bob Brown leased their house from them for two years and used it as a model and as a guest house.



In 1998, it became obvious that Art's health was not going to allow them to stay in their two-story colonial house in Ohio. After a lot of soul searching, they decided that Judy would retire, and they would move to Pine Lakes full time. Judy says that it turned out to be one of the best decisions they ever made. Art died in 2003, when they had been here only 5 years. On the flight back from his memorial service in Ohio, Judy decided that she would definitely remain in Pine Lakes and that she would say yes to any job that she was asked to do. At the time she was PLGA president and on the beautification committee. In 2004, Judy was appointed to the board of HOAII to fill the vacancy created with Jerry Henry's untimely death.

The first year here Judy played golf on Wednesdays with the 18-holers and played with a regular foursome on Mondays and Fridays. On Tuesdays she played bridge and the rest of the time was spent taking Art to doctors' appointments. During their second year Judy

was Shoot-Out Committee Chairman and that started a long line of jobs in the golf associations and throughout Pine Lakes. (See Judy's Resume Below)

Iunderstand that the Beautification Committee disbanded for a while. Who reinstated it? Mable Wurst reinstated it after a few years because she missed what the group had provided. However, it was John McCann who suggested that the Beautification Committee purchase the fountain in front of the clubhouse.

Judy, what is "Networking for Progress?" In 2009, a couple of women from Bradenton, Florida decided HOA board members from ELS age qualified communities should get together and network. Thus, was born Networking for Progress. Today she is on a committee that meets with the board members of these communities 3 or 4 times a year, then they meet as a committee to sort through the problems. Finally, they meet quarterly with ELS management in Tampa to talk about and hopefully resolve some of the problems.

Tell me about your childhood. There were three things that happened in my early childhood that shaped the person I became. The first was that I was raised in a very religious home so when you were old enough to talk you were old enough to get up in front of the church and quote Bible verses and sing Sunday school songs. So, at the age of 2 – 3, I recited Bible verses and sang songs. 
