The security cameras at the gate are beyond repair. Funds for new cameras will be requested in the 2017 budget.

The liaison meetings are held the second Thursday of every month and continue through the summer months. Residents are asked to talk to their respective board members if they would like to see issues addressed at this meeting.

# Pine Lakes Unique Terminology Explained WHAT?

hen I speak at Saturday morning coffee, do you know what I'm talking about? When I write for Whispering Pines, do you know what I'm talking about? Some people even say after I've told them something I clearly understand that they don't know what I'm talking about! I hope to rectify that situation right now with some of the unique FMO terminology that I'm guilty of using.

**FMO:** These letters stand for "Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida, Inc. This is a very important organization that all of Pine Lakes residents should belong to. The annual membership is only \$25 and definitely a necessary organization for manufactured home owners. FMO is our watchdog at the Florida legislature alerting us to bills that keep our lifestyle safe and those bills that we want our legislators to prevent passing.

<u>District 7</u>: FMO is divided into 17 Districts within the state of Florida. Pine Lakes is in District 7 which encompasses Charlotte, Lee, Collier, and Hendry counties.

**Back Bulletin Board**: This is the bulletin board closest to and across from the exercise room. There is a section called "FMO Happening" where all the latest news is updated.

**FMO Lottery**: At the beginning of January, February, and March, Florida Lottery tickets are purchased for FMO members. One ticket is purchased for the entire Pine Lakes' FMO membership and one ticket is purchased for the gold, silver, and bronze courts. If the winnings are large enough, they will be shared with whichever group won. If it is not feasible to share the winnings, the FMO representative in Pine Lakes will save or spend the winnings as she deems necessary. These rules can be changed by the Pine Lakes FMO representative (guess who that is).

Gold, or Silver, or Bronze hearts, or shamrocks, or stars: Those Courts that have the highest percentage of FMO members receive these symbols for their membership achievement, and their names are posted each month on the "FMO Members" sheet on the back bulletin board. Do you remember where I told you that back bulletin is located?

<u>The Golden Alligator Award</u>: The one court, in January or February, or March, which has the highest percentage of FMO members in all of Pine Lakes, receives a Golden Alligator which is tied to their court sign post in February, March, and April. Don't call PETA as the Golden Alligator is wooden!

<u>Membership Contests</u>: FMO sponsors membership contests for all FMOs in the state of FL. In 2015, Pine Lakes won second place in the statewide contest

This year, from March 1, 2016 to May 31, 2016, any FMO member who signs up five new members will receive \$25 or a one-year FMO membership for every five new members. Let's try it and call it "Pine Lakes FMO March/April Madness."

**FFFF-MO:** FFFF-MO is the mailbox alligator that sits on my front porch and waits for your filled out FMO membership applications and a \$25 check. FFFF-MO does get hungry and becomes very lonely when no one feeds him, so please step up to my porch and feed this poor, loving creature so he stays loving and not poor.

**FMO Members paper**: The sheet shows the membership percentages of every court in Pine Lakes. There are markings for the top three courts on estate land and also the top membership courts on leased land. The FMO Members page is posted on the back bulletin board every month. You do know where that is, don't you?

**FMO Decals**: These are round blue and white FMO decals. They adhere to windows by just rubbing on, no sticky stuff. You can place them on your house window or on your golf cart window. All FMO members should have one, but if you don't, just give me a call, and I'll deliver one to you. We want to brighten up Pine Lakes with these decals the way they brighten up and protect our wonderful lifestyle. Showing your decal tells everyone you are helping to keep us all secure.

Now that we all understand the FMO Pine Lakes <u>unique language</u> here are some FMO updates: The 2016 three-month <u>lottery</u> netted us \$0,000,000.00 each. #### **Understanding Social Security**

ver the last thirty years, government bureaucrats have quietly made a series of small, complex and highly technical changes to the way the "COLA" is calculated. By changing the calculation method, they lowered the "COLA" in a manner that hardly anyone would notice but which, over time, has slashed Social Security benefits by billions of dollars.

This cut is now having a **truly devastating** effect on tens of millions of Social Security recipients. Hundreds of thousands are being pushed below the poverty line. Others, already living in poverty, are having to choose between food and prescriptions or heat and rent.

Imagine the **human cost**: People have to cut back on prescriptions and take half a tablet instead of a whole one. As a result, their health suffers. They economize at the grocery store and the result is a low-cost, high-starch diet of foods like potatoes and bread that lacks the fruit, vegetables or protein we need to stay healthy.

**Finally, Congress will consider reform legislation** that is now sitting before the House and Senate. (Note: In

the last six years, Social Security recipients have not had a COLA in three of those years. And, it's only going to get worse going forward, without changes). The reform legislation being considered by congress right now will:

- First: Increase monthly Social Security checks (approximately up to \$70);
- Second: It improves the way the annual Social Security "COLA" is calculated so it more accurately reflects the rising cost of living;
- ◆ Third: It closes a loophole that allows millionaires and very wealthy individuals to pay Social Security on only a small part of their income; and
- Lastly: By closing this loophole it puts Social Security "In the Black."

What can you do to help move the reform legislation forward? It's easy. Write to Senators Nelson and Rubio and Representative Clawson. Ask them to move legislation forward!
